### **DAY RIDE - Fay-Luther Trail System**

**DATE:** Saturday, June 18, 2011

**TIME:** 11:00 A.M. Ready to Ride Out

**PLACE:** Faye Luther Trail System<sup>1</sup>



The Fay-Luther Trail System is an 8.9 mile network of linear and loop trails open to mountain bikes and equestrians that travel through both high desert and forested habitats. Common vegetation include Big Sagebrush, Rabbitbrush, Bitterbrush, Curlleaf Mountain-Mahogany, Jeffrey Pine, Singleleaf Pinyon and White Alder. A majority of these trails are sandy making it difficult for mountain bikes. Dogs are allowed during this time of the year. The Interpretive Loop Trail has interpretive signs about human history, fauna and flora and landscape forces of the area.

### **WHAT TO BRING**

1. Your Horse<sup>2</sup>
2. Sunscreen/Hat/Helmet
3. Sack Lunch
4. Water (Water on the Trail for Horses/Dogs)
5. First Aid Kit
6. Camera

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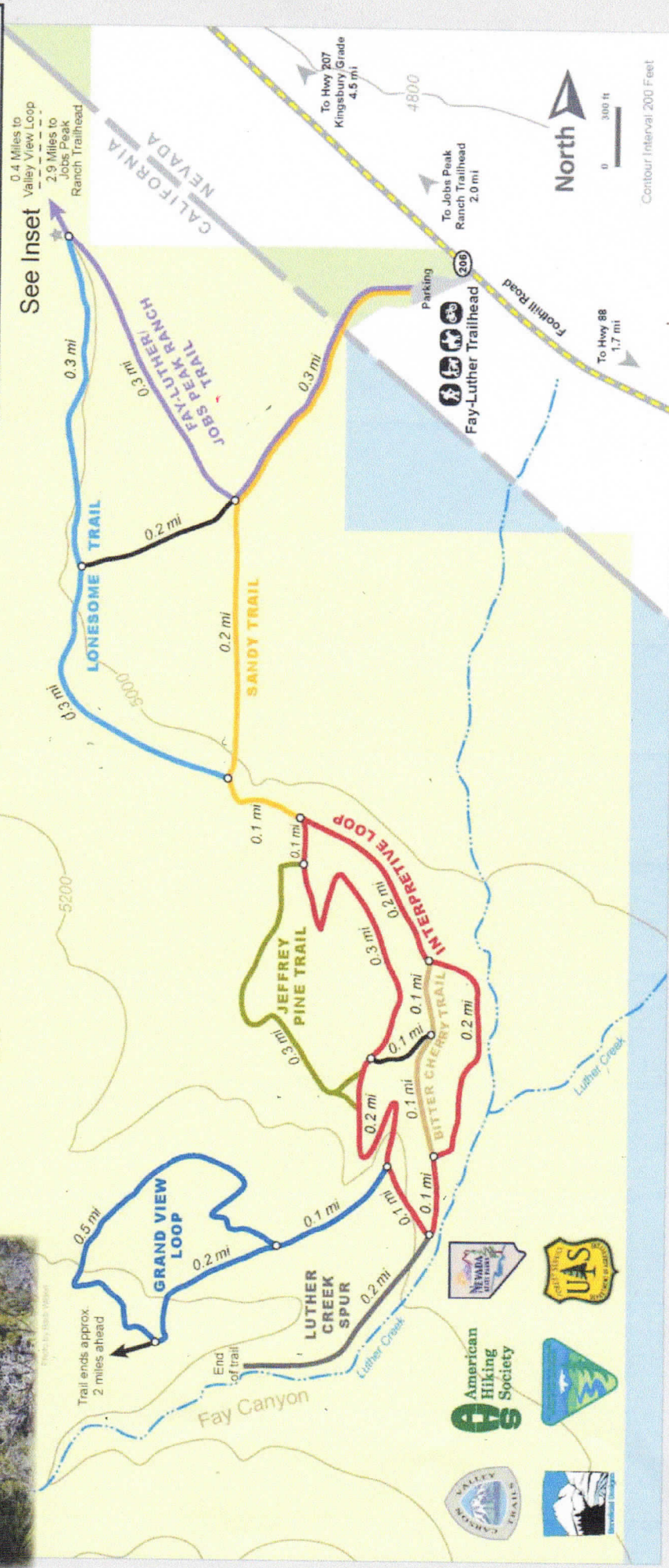
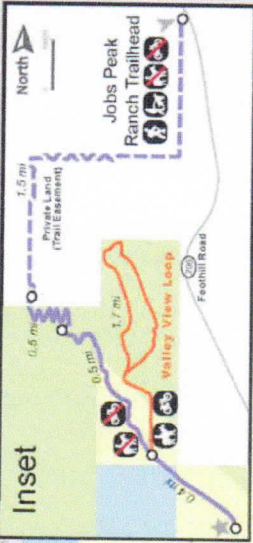
<sup>1</sup> **Directions:** *From the intersection* of Hwy 395 and Hwy 88 in Minden, drive south on Hwy 88 for 6.5 miles. Turn right on Fairview Lane and drive 1.7 miles (Fairview Lane becomes Foothill Road). The signed Fay-Luther Trailhead is located on the left side of the road. *From the intersection* of Hwy 207 and Foothill Road at the base of Kingsbury Grade, drive south on Foothill Road for 4.5 miles. The signed Fay-Luther Trailhead is located on the right side of the road. The signed Fay-Luther Trailhead is approximately 30 minutes (32 miles) from Carson City and an hour (57 miles) from Reno.

# Fay-Luther Trail System



**Trail Use:**

- Hiking: Respect private property and stay on designated trails
- Bicycles & Equestrians: Not allowed between Valley View Loop and Jobs Peak Ranch Trailhead for soil protection and easement restrictions through private land
- Dogs Allowed: Must be on leash November 15 - March 30 and year-round on easement through private land to protect winter deer habitat
- No Motor Vehicles
